### Introduction

- Young adults are exposed to a different dating environment than 25 years ago
- Previous typical male/female preferred traits
- Now a shift in societal attitudes
- Increase in online dating
- Why 1995?
- Generational transition
- · Advancements in computer technology

#### Thesis

Amongst young adults today, the factors that determine perceptions of sexual attraction differ significantly from just 25 years ago, largely due to a shift in personality preferences away from evolutionary characteristics, a decrease in conformity, and the rise of online dating platforms



### Discussion

- Decreased importance of evolutionary characteristics
  - Not necessary for survival
  - Shift away from gender roles
- Decrease in conformity when selecting for sexually attractive character traits
  - More selectivity
- Increase in online dating changes perceptions of what is seen as attractive
  - Favor of physical traits
  - Lingers with in-person dating
- Limitations
- Online dating for different reasons than in-person dating
- Advice for young adults
- Don't worry about gender roles
- Finding people will be harder
